- Discover Identify your inclusive agribusiness opportunity.
- Assess Understand the specific challenges of working with smallholders.
- Plant Consider five core solutions to challenges and enable your business to grow.
- Nurture Learn about opportunities to collaborate effectively with smallholders, with other partner organizations, and on the level of the business environment.
- Harvest Develop a plan on how to ensure mutual benefit for all business partners and assess results.

Workshop participants will be provided with the opportunity to network and exchange with representatives from farmers associations, donors, government, civil society organisations and other enablers to discuss options for inclusive business partnerships.
